## School Uniform

St Hilda's has taken the decision to make changes to our school uniform from September 2019. A new logo is being created and the colour of the polo shirts will change from yellow to white. We feel this will make purchasing and sourcing uniform easier and more affordable as white is more readily available. As with previous years uniform, the polo shirt does not have to have the school logo/emblem on it.

The cost of the uniform is exactly the same and can be purchased from our preferred supplier John McHugh in Stretford Mall (the old Post Office) either in store or online.

Children who will be moving into Year 6 will be required to wear a shirt and tie. We feel this will assist in their transition to high school and show the younger children what they are aspiring to. Ties will be provided by school and given to the children in Year 6.

Below is an image of the proposed new uniform, however, this is not the final article. You will be able to purchase the final article from John McHughs from the end of July, ready for September.

We anticipate a cross-over period and should your child still fit into their old uniform, this is not an issue and it can still be worn for school.

All items the children wear in school, i.e. uniform, shoes, coats, trainers must all be labelled with their name. Personalised labels can be purchased at reasonable rates, along with laundry pens, where names can be written on labels. This is highly recommended as an option as it would work out cheaper than replacing lost items.
