## INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 At St Hilda's Primary School, we have high expectations of our pupils and their uniform. Outsiders often judge a school by the appearance of its pupils in public. Wearing a uniform encourages a feeling of security and gives a sense of belonging to a community.

## LABELING OF SCHOOL UNIFORM

### 2.1

All individual parts of the school uniform must be labelled with your child's name and their year group.

## NURSERY SCHOOL UNIFORM

### 3.1 **Pupils are expected to wear the following school uniform:**

- White polo shirt (with or without school logo)
- Navy jogging bottoms (for comfort and easy to manage for toileting)
- Navy shorts (summer)
- Blue gingham dress (summer)
- School sweatshirt (blue with logo)
- Black school shoes
- Pair of wellingtons
- Waterproof coat
- **Please note: a P.E. kit is not required for children in Nursery or Reception.**
- **We ask that all clothing items and bags be clearly labelled.**

## SCHOOL UNIFORM- RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

### 3.2 **Pupils are expected to wear the following school uniform:**

- Blue jumper or cardigan with the school crest.
- Grey trousers.
- Grey skirt/ pinafore dress.
- Grey or navy tights/ socks.
- Reception to Year 5: white polo shirt – tucked in.
- Year 6: white shirt.
- Year 6: tie – this is provided by the school in September.
- Black school shoes- no trainers.
- Blue gingham Summer dress.
- Grey or navy leggings should only be worn for religious reasons.
- Coat/ raincoat

## PE KIT- YEAR 1 TO YEAR 6

4.1 Children are expected to come to school dressed in their PE kit on their allocated PE day. The day will be shared with families via the blog in September. If PE kits are needed for any other reason, families will be informed via the class blog.

### **Pupils are expected to wear the following PE kit:**

- Plain navy/ black shorts.
- Navy/ black leggings or tracksuit bottoms- no logos.
- Plain white t-shirt.
- Plain navy/ black sweatshirt – no logos.
- Trainers.
- PE in the hall will be done in bare feet or children can bring a pair of black pumps- these can be stored in the child's locker.

Children are not to come in branded clothing or football kits etc.

Pupils who do not bring their PE kit will still be expected to participate in classes. A spare PE kit will be given to wear. Children will be sent home with a letter for parents informing them to bring their PE kit.

## ACCESSORIES

### 5.1 Hair Accessories

- All hair accessories should navy/black and be discreet.

### 5.2 Jewellery

- Only stud earrings can be worn in school. No other jewellery is permitted unless for religious reasons.

### 5.3 Make-Up and Nail-Polish

- Make-up and nail varnish is not to be worn in school and children wearing it will be asked to remove it.
